STOP 02 TEMURIDS HISTORY MUSEUM

Museum of the Temurids History

A must-visit for every traveller, the museum opened in 1996 for the 660th anniversary of the great commander Amir Timur — known worldwide as Tamerlane.

Its galleries tell the story of Uzbekistan under the Timurid dynasty: jewellery, clothing, instruments and tools of the Middle Ages, plus correspondence between Tamerlane's court and the monarchs of Europe.

Alay Dehkan Bazaar



Inside the Alay (Oloy) Bazaar, Tashkent

The most famous and oldest bazaar in Tashkent, its story reaches back to when the Great Silk Road crossed Central Asia.

With its handsome facade and grand central entrance, the Alay Bazaar earns a prominent place in photographs of the city's landmarks — a living market established in the second half of the 1870s.
